Marking the 77th Year since the Liberation of Deportees from Larger Lindele

Words from the Chair, Jill Chubb, at the Memorial Plaque White Rock at 11am 23rd April 2022.

On behalf of the Guernsey Deportees Association, I would welcome to this ceremony Canon Christopher Routledge, the German Honorary Consul Chris Betley and his guest from Biberach Germany, Mona. Also of course, we are pleased to see Tom Renfry past chairman of the Association for 22 years and last, but not least, Deportees, family and friends. I would also like to mention my good friend Heather who made the beautiful flower arrangements which will be laid at the end of our memorial service along with your own personal flowers of remembrance.

We are gathered here this morning to remember and honour the people who were deported from Guernsey in WWII men women and children and especially those never to return home again to see family or friends or these beautiful Islands. We also remember the people who died subsequently as a result of their captivity although not named on the memorial plaque. I personally would like to honour and remember someone who's always in my heart my father John Wild. Today, St. George's Day, marks the 77th year of our liberation from the Prisoner of War Camp Lager Lindele in Biberach. The camp was liberated by the Moroccan French soldiers, and these were followed by the Americans who gave all of us children chocolates and chewing gum and rides on their Jeep, they were the first smiling soldiers I had seen, a gift from heaven, and I thank God we were liberated on April 23rd 1945.

I would now like to read a message sent from Helga Reiser on behalf of the Biberach Friends of Guernsey. *

After receiving this I also heard from Josepha Brugger, Sabine Engelhardt's successor, she also informed us that they also held their memorial service on the 22nd in order that we could have photos to show everyone at our luncheon. * I have been in touch with her thanking her very much and that they will be shown in our next newsletter.
