## Words from the Chair, Jill Chubb

Welcome to our latest Newsletter. September this year marks the 80<sup>th</sup> year since the deportations began. In September 1942 the first orders for the "evacuation" of selected Channel Islanders were issued, and on Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> September the first boat of Deportees from Guernsey left for France. Dr Gilly Carr has indicated that she may make the trip to Dorsten to mark this occasion which was the first Internment Camp for many. The Committee have agreed it would be appropriate for Dr Carr to be our Official Representative and for her formally to represent the Association and its interests. Dr Carr is currently working on a book soon to be published called 'A Materiality of Internment'. This will be the academic book equivalent of 'Occupied Behind Barbed Wire' and will give greater insight into the transit camps like Dorsten and Compiegne so often overlooked by historians. More details later.

On a lighter note, we are planning to hold a get together for everyone at les Cotils for coffee and mince pies on the  $6^{th}$  of December, starting at 10.15 in the Bar Area. This is the first occasion that we have been able to organise an event together, due to previous Covid restrictions, and it will be great to meet up again. I hope that as many of you as possible will be able to attend. I do need to know the approximate numbers attending so please email me (see above) or phone 728205 to let me know one way or the other.

As there was no subsidised lunch this year, the Committee have donated £100 to the Friends of Ukraine EOD charity. This charity works with others to make safe unexploded ordinance that pose a threat to civilians.
